Out of these prospects, the four speakers for the 1962 Senior Class were chosen. They are Eloise Evans, Sandra Hockenberg, Zack Bolt, and David Licht.

"An American Creed" was used for the tryout topic for the first time this year. The contest was judged by the senior teachers and other members of the faculty who wished to help. A point system, based on stage appearance, poise, memorization, interpretation, voice, and ability to write a. speech, was used to make the speaker selections.

This year's Commencement Speakers have contributed much to the school. Sandra and Eloise are in the Pep Club and Anchor Club, while Zack and David are members of the Key Club. The latter three also belong to the National Honor Society. All of the speakers rank in the upper third of the Senior Class, with Sandra, Zack, and David in the upper three per cent.

The speakers will choose some topic that will be of interest to the graduating class. The speeches will be presented at Commencement, which will be held in the East High Auditorium on May 29, 1962.

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Prepare Now

With graduation rapidly approaching, most seniors begin to look at themselves objectively; many do not like what they see. They realize they have been lazy and irresponsible in their school work because they were unwilling to put forth an effort or accept responsibility.

Now they begin to wonder what will happen to them when they apply for college admission. With the rising college admission standards so high, will they be accepted. If so, will they be able to make the grade and pass? "If only I had learned my English," some may moan. Others simply pretend that they do not care. Secretly, though, everyone envies the position of those who have been studious.

Now is the time for YOU to resolve to be more attentive in class and more receptive to new ideas. It is up to you to decide which is more important - a few moments' pleasure or the preparation looking for angles. necessary for a good vocation.

Passing Exams

Two factors are involved in your taking an examination. One is the preparation you do in advance and the other is your mental and physical condition during the test. Actually, good preparation demands day-to-day study for an exam. Waiting until the last minute to cram will result in confusion and will gain nothing.

Assuming you have properly prepared yourself by advance study, let's analyze factors involving your physical and mental condition during the exam. First of all, make sure you have plenty of sleep the night before so you can think clearly. A tired brain cannot produce and work up peak efficiency if not rested.

When you come into the exam room you will, of course, be somewhat tense. Some degree of tension is good as it will make you alert, but too much will make you nervous and destroy your ability to think clearly,

When you get the exam, look it over. Read all the questions before you answer any of them. This will give you the opportunity to allot your time for each question. By starting out right away and not looking over the test, you may offer an answer that would better fit another question. Determine exactly how you are going to answer the questions before you begin. Answer your essay questions first, while they are fresh in your mind. Once you have started your exam be sure you are answering the question that is being asked. Don't beat around the bush and put down words that mean nothing. Don't try to offer more than is asked. If the question calls for an outline or a summary, make it that. If a question bothers you, go on to the next one and come back to it later. Make a few brief notes, particularly on essay questions, of items you want to include in your answer. If you don't do this you may find afterwards you have omitted major factors in the answer.

Write as simply as you can and don't complicate your answer as this only creates confusion on your part. Make sure your answers are logical and informative. You should plan your time to allow a few minutes to check over your paper. Watch your grammar and spelling.

Remember, you are the master of the exam, don't let the exam DECA, February, 1962 master you.
